Asia Workshop on Low Carbon Asia Research Project

Background and objectives of the workshop

<Background>

- 1. In reaction to the UNFCCC's establishment of new commitments towards low-carbon development in developing countries, countries are hastening the pace of formulating their plans against global warming.
- 2. Asian countries in particular have become the focus of worldwide attention on how to set a path towards low-carbon development, as it is Asian countries which have been experiencing rapid growth, and they hold the key of climate stabilisation.
- 3. From its establishment in 2009, LCS-RNet has had a programme to promote the organisation of policy dialogues between policy-makers and researchers in Indonesia, Thailand, Cambodia, and Malaysia, as well as networking among researchers to assist their activities, so as to go ahead with sound low-carbon Asia policies in a scientific manner.
- 4. At our Malaysia workshop held in July 2011, it was encouraged to establish LCSR Asia League towards low-carbon development in Asia.
- 5. Quite a few agencies, donors, academic institutions and private consultants (eg. UNEP-DTIE, ADB, and CLEAN...) have begun to undertake research and provide advisory services and capacity building on low-carbon development in developing countries.

<Objectives>

This workshop has the following aims:

- 1. To provide opportunities for 1) promoting sharing/enhancing knowledge on LCS studies amongst researchers in Asia, as well as 2) encouraging dialogues between researchers and policy-makers so that researchers in Asia can be actively engaged in supporting national/regional low-carbon developing policies.
- 2. As a follow-up our previous workshop in July, to conduct a frank exchange of views on how to establish a self-independent, autonomous, and long-lasting research network in Asia in the future, by promoting a south-south cooperation scheme.

This workshop is composed of three parts, 1) PART-I: Workshop on Low Carbon Nations (in the morning of 31 October 2011), 2) PART-II: Workshop on Low-Carbon Cities in Asia (in the afternoon of 31 October), and 3) PART-III: Workshop on LCS Modeling (in the morning of 1 November).
