Background and aim







- On May 10, 2023, the members of parliament decided that the first Citizens' Assembly of the German Bundestag should deal with the topic of "Nutrition in transition: between a private matter and state responsibilities".
- Handing over recommendations to the members of the German Bundestag by the end of February 2024 in the form of a citizens' report

Aim

- The Citizens' Assembly advises the German Bundestag on food policy by drawing up a differentiated statement based on everyday experience and then formulating specific recommendations on key points.
- In addition, the Citizens' Assembly on Nutrition is intended to test the Citizens' Assembly format as an element of citizen participation at federal level. The aim of the Citizens' Report is to achieve a quality of results that is perceived as helpful for opinion-forming in the political process, without the results restricting the freedom of decision of members of parliament.


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























- •Each session deals with one of the prioritized topics
- •Agenda for each session:
 - •First exchange in small groups on the topic
 - •Input from two experts
 - •Discussion on the topic in small groups: Questions, thoughts, ideas
 - Comparison with main ideas from another small group
 - Evaluation and sharing of thoughts and ideas in plenary

Afterwards, evaluation of the collected questions, thoughts and ideas by a citizens' editorial group

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Quality of results: The recommendations









- The Citizens' Assembly draws up a small number of central recommendations (max. 9). The smaller the number of recommendations, the more precisely they must be formulated, giving the citizens time to resolve (target) conflicts.
- To increase compatibility, all recommendations are given the following structure:
 - Title
 - Strategic goal
 - Description of the measure: "We recommend that..."
 - Justification

Involvement of experts









All inputs and knowledge transfer in the Citizens' Assembly are based on the following principles:

- 1) Relevance to the Citizens' Assembly: What do the citizens need to know in order to develop fact-based recommendations?
- **2) Balance:** What perspectives and arguments should citizens be aware of in order to be able to make informed decisions?

- **3) Comprehensibility**: Which experts speak as simply and comprehensibly as possible so that all participants can follow along easily?
- **4) Diversity:** Which mix of experts reflects society well (gender, age, science and practice, people affected, etc.)?

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Role of the Scientific Advisory Board









- Advising on the content and thematic design of the deliberative process
- Monitoring the balance of the proposed pool of experts, making suggestions for additional inputs
- Advising the implementation team

- Providing feedback from a scientific perspective on the Citizens' Assembly's draft recommendations before the third weekend
- Roles as multipliers for the process


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Implications









- * Right now eight recommendations are elaborated they form a broad spectrum (from information and nutritional labelling to reduction of taxes)
- * The strengths and weaknesses of the process cannot yet be definitively identified in the context of the current process.
- * However, it is clear that the citizens are currently developing very differentiated recommendations.
- * One weakness, of course, is the tight time frame until Feb 2024

2nd weekend: Sorting and detailed discourse









Friday, November 10

- Collection of the results of the three online sessions
- Group sorting: What fits together, where are there conflicts? Etc.

Saturday, November 11

- Exchange with members of the German Bundestag
- * Excursions, e.g. to farms, stores, supermarkets or restaurants, clinics, production facilities etc. (in and around Berlin)

Sunday, November 12

- Conflict Mapping
- Dealing with conflicts in plenary sessions

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4th-6th online sessions: Instruments









- Each session deals with one instrument and picks up on the topics and approaches that were assigned to the respective instrument as a solution on the second weekend.:
 - Information, transparency, labeling
 - Standards and other regulations (e.g. animal welfare, environment, sustainability, advertising bans)
 - Pricing (e.g. taxes, subsidies, grants)
- Knowledge and education are considered as cross-sectional topics in all three online sessions.
- Agenda for each session:
 - Input from two experts
 - Work in small groups:
 - What do we want to recommend (measure), why (justification), and for what purpose (goal)?
 - Groups that develop very similar recommendations are asked to look at the results of the other group(s)

3rd weekend: Recommendations









Preparation:

- Summary of the proposed recommendations and identification of contradictions by the citizens' editorial group
- Feedback on the factual basis of the proposed recommendations by the Scientific Advisory Board

Aims and results:

- Dealing with the feedback from the experts
- In-depth discussion of own results, dealing with concerns
- Reaching a consensus: Clearing up reasons that stand in the way of approval
- Final formulation
- Reconciliation and prioritization of the results

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
