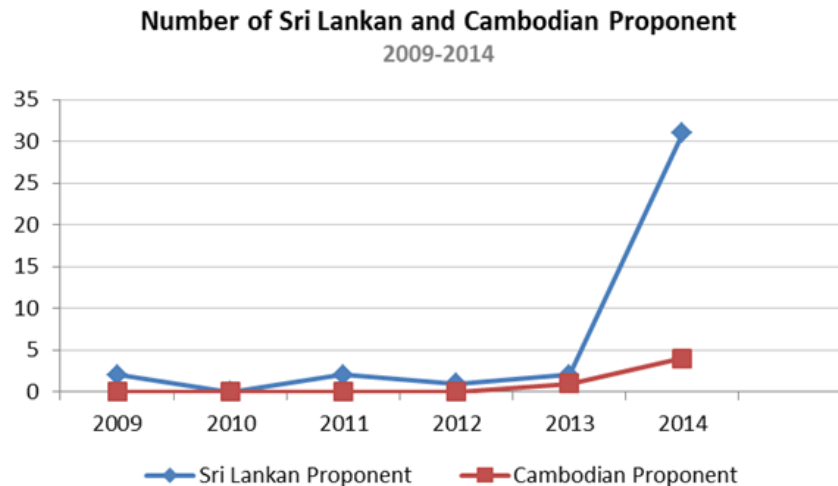

(ex: Sri Lanka)

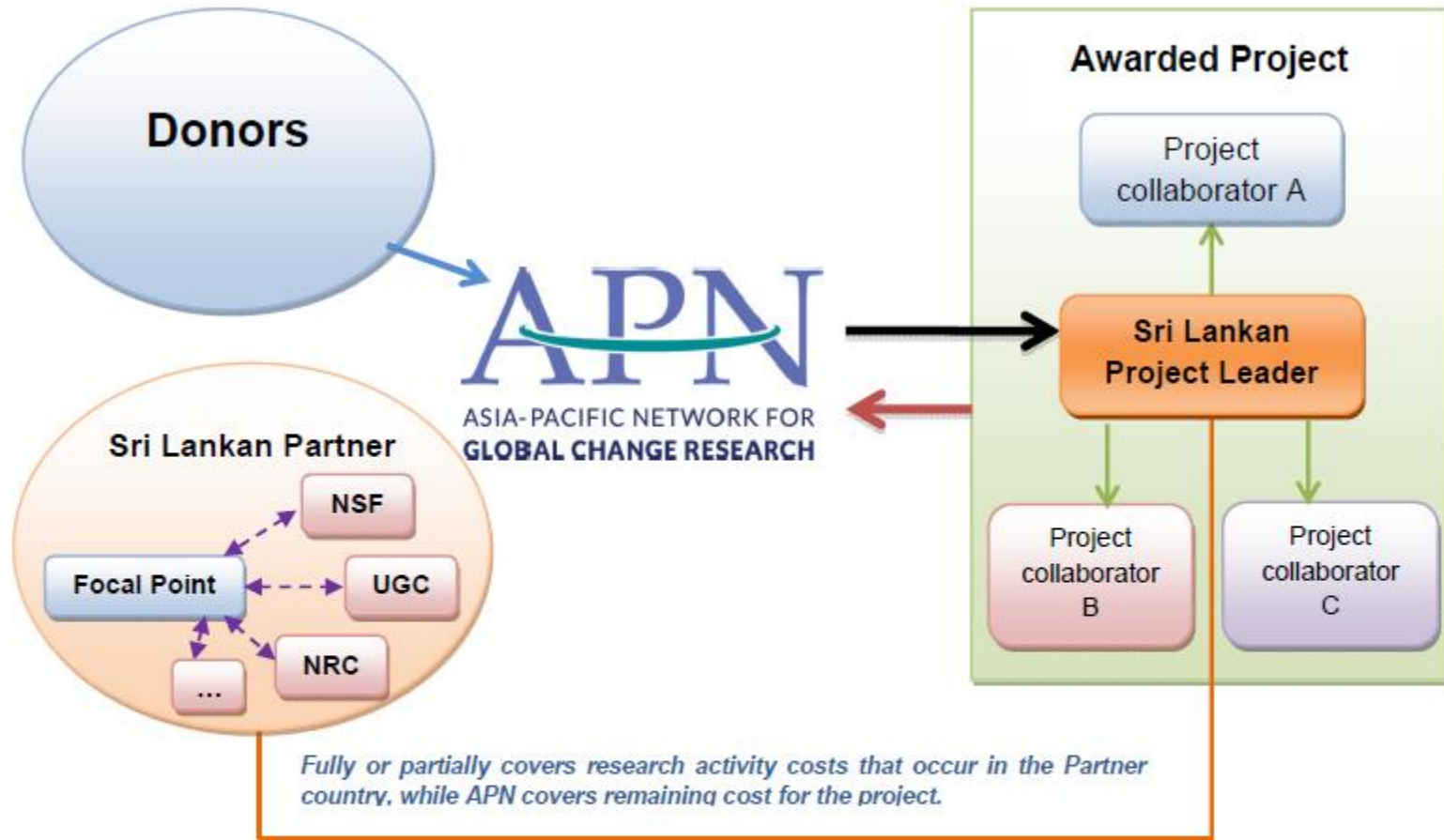


Figure: Conceptual Framework of the Partnership

Green Lines: Project leader distributes the project funds among the collaborators

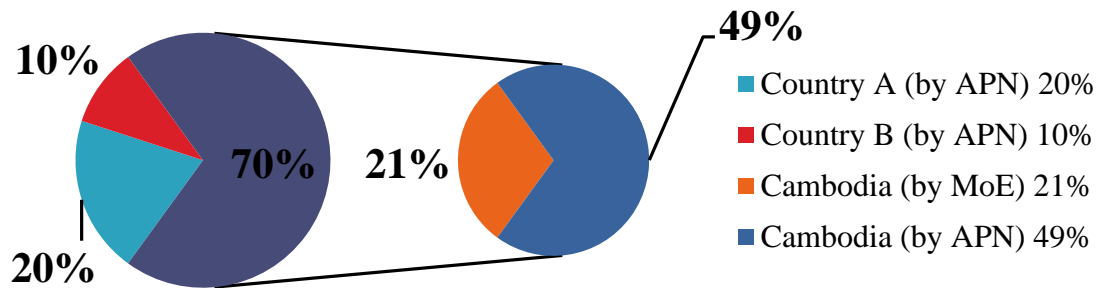

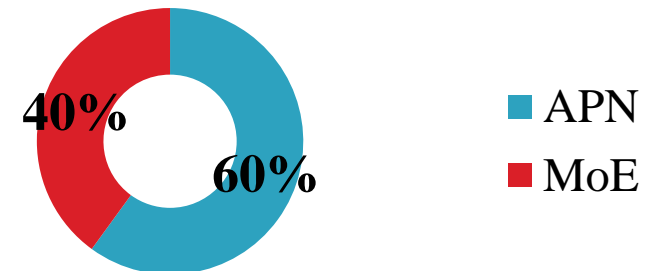
Cambodia

- ❖ Partnership established on 10 July 2014;
- ❖ Term of partnership: July 2014 to June 2019;
- ❖ Scope of partnership (year 1): CAPaBLE, CAF, other partnership activities;
- ❖ Identified two mechanisms for funding under the partnership:

Sri Lanka

❖ Milestones

- Former Secretariat Director, Dr. Takemoto, visited Sri Lanka (May);
- Video conference with MONRE & funding agencies on details (July);
- Draft MoU was prepared for comments from MONRE, NSF/UGC (August);

❖ Progress

- MONRE is coordinating the communication with NSF and UGC for their comments on the draft MoU
 - APN asked to contact the Ministry of External Affairs and the Department of External Resources for any MoU with government agencies in Sri Lanka.
